Covid-Omicron in the Community

Dear Parents & whānau

I am sure you will all be aware that the Omicron virus is now spreading quickly through the community, as expected. In our area several local schools have now reported cases at their schools.

Yesterday we confirmed that we had one case of a person who is now confirmed as positive who was at school for one day. This person was in Room 28 last Friday. On that day the person had no symptoms and felt well. Over the weekend the person began to show symptoms and on Sunday took a COVID test. The results came back as positive on Tuesday afternoon. This person has not been back at school since last Friday, and is now isolated at home. Everyone in Room 28 wore masks at school.

We believe the only close contacts would be the children in Room 28 (a senior year 6 class) and the teacher who was in the class that day because although the person felt well, they were probably potentially infectious. All Room 28 children and the teacher are now isolating at home awaiting test results.

We believe it is reasonable that all other children are at low risk and that they may continue to attend school. However I do understand that some parents may want to be more cautious for a few days, especially if you have siblings of a child in Room 28.

In every school and workplace we can expect there to be cases and people isolating as close contacts over the next few weeks with Omicron spreading. We should all be prepared.

Please follow our best advice and that of Public Health

- always monitor your own health and that of your children
- stay home if you have any symptoms such as sore throat, runny nose, cough, fever
- if these continue, get a test and await a result
- wear masks for added protection
- get vaccinated if you haven't already done so
- always know where you have been; use the QR code
- isolate at home if you are notified as a close contact of a case for the required time

Every learner is expected to wear a Tirimoana bucket hat or school cap. These can be purchased for \$12 from the office.




School Stationery
