Moving on from COVID mandates

You will most likely be aware that as of midnight last night, the Government lifted most of the COVID mandates. At school this means that mask wearing is no longer required. However individual staff and students may continue to wear masks if they wish.

If someone in your household tests positive for COVID, other people in your household will not have to stay in isolation at home. Instead they must monitor their wellbeing, check for symptoms and take a RAT test for 5 days.

We will continue to remind children to wash their hands regularly, to use hand sanitiser and to stay home when feeling unwell. In classrooms we will continue to recommend good ventilation.

Please be aware that there is currently a tummy bug circulating through the school. For most people this is a 24 hour bug. We will contact parents to collect their child if the child vomits at school.

Applicants are accepted in the following order:


Out of Zone Application Priorities

If you have already notified school that your Out of Zone child will be coming to school in 2023 then you do not need to reapply.




