#### This week's PB4L Focus: Applying Effort, Engagement in Learning

This week's PB4L lesson has focused on "Engagement in Learning" and the effort we need to apply to do this well. Classes have been sharing expectations around learning and how children can demonstrate respect to their teacher through their learning. Please continue these conversations at home, that when you apply effort to learning you are doing your best and have learning to be proud of. Children need to know school is about learning.

#### When you have a complaint to share with the school

Sometimes things happen at school that do not seem right, or that may be inappropriate for a primary school. These things happen because we are all human, and we can all make mistakes. We teach children about this - you are not expected to be perfect and you are expected to learn from mistakes. The same thing often applies to adults.

Sometimes complaints are about how school deals with children who are disruptive, hurtful or when they bully someone else. Sometimes a parent might feel not enough has been done. Other times a complaint might be about a child coming home and telling a parent about something a teacher may have done or said.

The school has a Complaints Policy and we recommend that when making a complaint, that you check out the policy. Generally, it is best if a parent raises a concern with a teacher, to check to see if what they have heard or seen needs explaining. Usually there is a rational explanation for something, and if not, we will acknowledge the mistake and will ensure it doesn't happen again. All complaints are dealt with sensitively and as thoroughly as we can. We do not leap to assumptions - we check with the people concerned and we talk with witnesses, if possible.

## **Complaints Process**

We aim to handle all concerns and complaints quickly, respectfully, and professionally, and strive to resolve them effectively for everyone involved.



#### **Children Sharing their Learning**

This week I have had several learners from across the school sharing examples of their writing, handwriting and mathematics learning with me. Children feel proud when they are able to show their principal examples of quality learning or improvement in their learning. It is heartening to see effort and pride from our young learners.



#### Picking up your children at the end of the school day- School finishes at 3.00pm

This is a friendly reminder that school ends at 3pm each day, and we expect students to be collected at this time. We understand that there can sometimes be minor delays in collecting students, and when this happens children are asked to **sit outside the school** 

office until you arrive.

We have noticed that a number of children are not being collected until 3.30pm or later, and they are either remaining outside the school gates or have been told by parents to remain on the playground to play. The school ground is not supervised and we do not encourage this practice.

We ask that owners bringing a dog or dogs onto the school grounds follow the guidelines below.

- If the dog is considered by the council or any other authority to be a breed that needs muzzling, the dog must be muzzled on school property.
- Dog owners should help educate children about how best to approach their dog.
- Owners must remove any mess left by their dog.
