We remind all parents that there is no parking along most of Metric Place during the following times:

- 8:30 AM 9:15 AM
- 2:30 PM 3:15 PM

It has come to our attention that some drivers are mounting grass verges outside properties and causing damage to the lawns. Our neighbours are understandably becoming very frustrated by this behaviour.




