## This week's PB4L Focus: Compassion



This week, we explored the power of kindness and how small actions make a big difference. Students discussed ways to help others, whether by including someone new, using kind words, or offering support when needed. Through stories, songs, and role-play, we practiced showing kindness in different situations. Ask your child about one act of kindness they did this week and how it made them feel.

# He aha te tupu i Tirimoana! What's happening at Tirimoana!

Over the past two weeks teachers and children have been completing assessments in classes from Year 3 to Year 6. The data from these assessments helps teachers to identify gaps and next steps for learning, and to identify both high achieving students, and lower achieving ones needing extra support.

Primarily our school uses Progress and Achievement Tests (PATs) and eAsttle tests in writing and mathematics. PATs help us compare children's achievement in relation to children of the same age anywhere in New Zealand. Both assessment tools have been recommended by the Ministry of Education for primary age students.

In Years 1 and 2, teachers are completing assessments in Reading (BSLA), Writing and Mathematics. Year 1 teachers have begun the cycle of Ministry of Education Phonics checks.



### Positive Engagement in the Classroom

One of our current Strategic Goals is to focus on positive student engagement in learning. However, many teachers have noticed a growing tendency by some children to believe that they can opt out of learning tasks, say 'no' to teachers' instructions, or use throw-away comments like "I don't have to; it is boring; why should I?"

Our message to children is that everyone follows the teacher's instructions, and learning is not optional. Do not be surprised if we speak with any parents about children who need further understanding of what is expected of them in the classroom. Our aim is for every child to be a positively engaged learner, at their level. No child has the right to refuse reasonable instruction by the teacher.

Please support teachers by reinforcing this message with your children.



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
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
